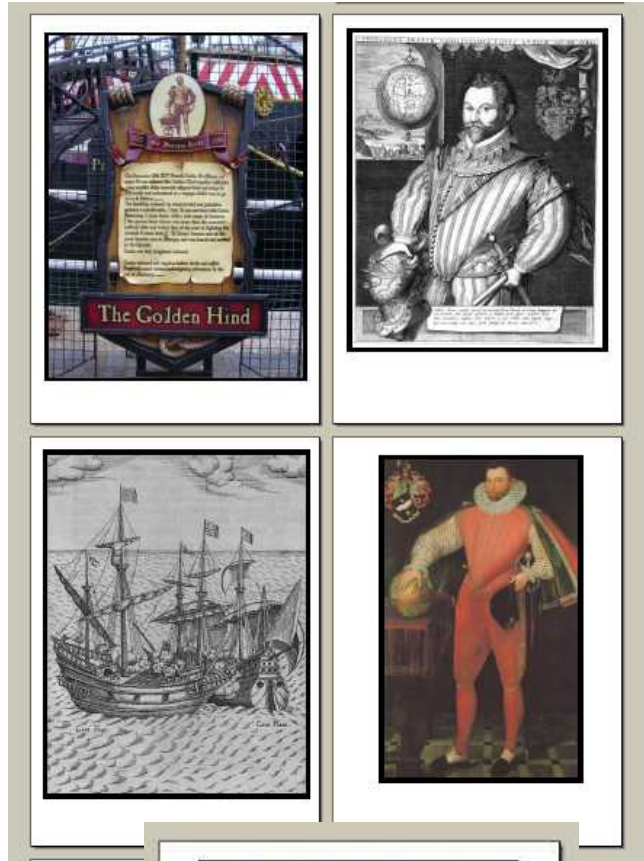










276. Tudor Exploration KS2 Sir Francis Drake

<p>September 30th 1578</p> <p>The <i>Merigold</i> was sunk in a storm. All on board were lost. The <i>Golden Hind</i> and <i>Elizabeth</i> were blown 300 miles south to Cape Horn.</p>  	<p>October 7th 1578</p> <p>A violent storm separated the <i>Golden Hind</i> and the <i>Elizabeth</i> who was under the command of Captain Winter. The <i>Elizabeth</i> waited for the <i>Golden Hind</i> but then returned home alone.</p>  
<p>Labels</p>	
<p>At the end of October, Drake's ship, the <i>Golden Hind</i>, headed north on its own, up the Pacific coast of South America. Along the way he raided several Spanish towns and captured as much gold and silver as he could.</p>  	<p>December 5th 1578</p> <p>Captured a Spanish ship carrying gold and wines then stopped for the <i>Golden Hind</i> to be refitted.</p>
