

85. The Great Fire of London Picture Pack

There are **24 PDF files** full of ideas, pictures, posters, worksheets etc

The majority of individual pictures are A4 and several are in full colour. Many of these are also resized to A5 and can be used for display OR as suggested in the detailed lesson plans.

They can be put out on the children's tables for them to look at and discuss in talking pairs or groups. The pictures allow for comparisons.

Publisher files are included in case you want to add or change anything.

PDFs include

- Lesson Plans
- Two A4 drawings of street scenes 1666 and now for comparison.
- Six A4 pictures relating to fire & fire fighting in 1666 and one A4 photograph of modern fire fighting in London for discussion & comparison.
- What does this picture tell you? - 3 A4 sheets with same A5 picture of fire fighting in 1666 (with and without lines for writing)
- Four A4 Posters for display (1666)
- A4 sheet showing 3 pictures of timber-framed houses including one 'cutaway' picture showing the internal structure (1600s)
- Seven A4 pictures. Each picture is intended as a large sequencing activity (washing line) to tell the story of the Great Fire Of London. Five of the seven are in colour.
- The same pictures (as above) but 6 to one A4 sheet. (sequencing activity?)
- Children's pictures (same as above) but in black/white—children cut, stick and sequence the pictures to tell the story of the fire.
- Captions to match the pictures—children cut & stick matching caption to picture to sequence the story.
- Large Captions for the teacher (same as children's captions but bigger!)
- 3 sheets of Writing Paper with and without lines (lines vary in depth) all have same picture (narrow band) and space for child's own illustrations.
- Four A4 sheets of St Paul's Then & Now including 2 A4 pictures.
- Writing paper—statue of woman outside St Paul's (could be used to compare clothes then & now)
- Match the sentences (easier version) eg London was a very _____ busy, crowded place. Cut & stick activity or write on grid—2 sheets.
- Heads & Tails activity (as suggested in QCA document) cut & stick to match two halves of sentences eg The fire started in the bakery because _____ a spark set light to some sticks on the floor.
- Answering Questions—A4 sheet of prompt questions relating to the fire & its effects.
- Story Word Bank—A4 sheet of useful words
- 80 plus words relating to The Great Fire of London for display. 3 word labels per A4 sheet
- A5 versions of several pictures
