

85. The Great Fire of London Picture Pack

There are **24 PDF files** full of ideas, pictures, posters, worksheets etc

Many of these are also resized to A5 and can be used for display OR as suggested in the detailed lesson plans, can be put out on the children's tables for them to look at and discuss in talking pairs or groups. Objective 1: For the children to have an awareness of how technology has changed over time.

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Detailed lesson plans with objectives :

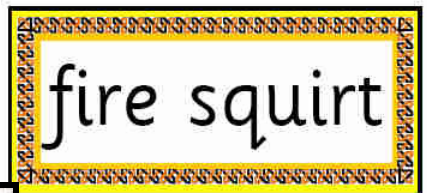
First Session (this covers more than one lesson) for the children to have an awareness of how technology has changed over time.
